# **Worship Volunteers**

#### Volunteers may choose to serve at 4pm on Saturdays, or 8:30 or 11am on Sundays

#### **Ushers**

Ushers assist before worship by helping people find seats, and during worship by collecting the offering.

#### **Greeters**

Greeters stand at an entry door and welcome those who are coming to worship.

#### **Service Coordinator**

Coordinators arrive before worship to check in volunteers, greet and answer questions at the Welcome Center and are accessible before, during, and for a short time after each service. May be required to unlock and or lock the building.

#### **Presentation of Gifts**

These individuals bring the bread and wine to the pastor following the homily and before the eucharistic liturgy. This can be done as a family.

#### Musician (choir/bells/worship team/brass/special services)

Each ensemble rehearses on Thursday evenings. All levels of musical ability are welcome and encouraged to participate! **Choir and Bells** meet most Thursdays and offer music in worship 1-2 times a month from mid-September until late May each year. **Worship team** members serve approximately 1-3 times a month throughout the year. **Brass** ensembles offer music approximately 6 times throughout the year. Brass players at a high school level and above are able to participate. Music for all ensembles is offered far in advance.

#### **Cantor**

These singers help lead the congregation in the mass, hymns, and sung psalms and volunteer approximately 1-2 services a month. All materials are given well in advance so that individuals can practice, prepare, and meet with one of the music ministers if needed.

#### **Tech Booth: Sound, Slides, and Livestream**

People who have an interest in tech, computers, or similar can be trained to work in the tech booth. Team members can learn one or more jobs in the booth such as: adjusting sound levels during service, running slides from the computer, recording and live streaming the service. No previous experience or knowledge is required, just a willingness to learn. Time commitment varies from one service a month to every other week.

#### **Altar Care**

The Altar Care group prepares the communion ware prior to each Eucharist, and cleans up after Eucharist.

#### **Coffee and Donuts - Fellowship**

Fellowship volunteers pick up the donuts and juice on Sunday mornings, prepare the coffee and get juice and donuts ready for distribution. They also clean up after fellowship time ends.

#### **Point/Response Team**

Point volunteers are trained to handle emergency situations. Support volunteers provide additional assistance to the point volunteers should an emergency take place.

## **Parish Education**

#### **Sunday School Teacher**

Sunday School Teachers work with children from infancy to high school, guiding them through the stories of Scripture, revealing God's love for them. Curriculum is provided by Pastor Vieth. This is a one hour commitment on Sunday mornings.

#### **Youth Mentor**

Youth Mentors primarily work with youth from sixth through twelfth grade. Trinity Youth meets on Sunday evenings from 6–8 PM and focuses on providing youth with meaningful social engagement as well as opportunities for serving the Church and world.

#### **Adult Bible Study Leader**

An adult Bible Study Leader teaches or facilitates a group in the study of a Biblical book or topic.

#### **Connection Group Leader**

A Connection Group Leader gathers a group of people together regularly for Bible Study, prayer, and fellowship.

#### **Membership Class Sponsor**

A Membership Class Sponsor attends class with someone who is new to Trinity and encourages and supports them as they are on the path to membership.

#### **Vacation Bible School**

A Vacation Bible School volunteer can serve in many different capacities from leading a group of children, teaching Bible Stories, assisting in the snack area, or assisting a teacher.

# **Facilities Care**

#### **Pew Crew**

Volunteers monitor/replace pew cards and dust the sanctuary/altar area two mornings a month. (This is not the same as the Dusting Crew that dusts the gathering space, hallway, closet, and parenting room).

#### **Dusting**

Volunteers sign up monthly to dust the Gathering Space, main hallway, closet and parenting room.

#### **Adopt a Garden**

Volunteers "adopt" an area on our campus to weed, and plant if they wish, from spring until fall.

#### **Parking Lot Weeding Crew**

Volunteers are assigned an island in the parking lot to weed from spring until fall.

# **Events**

#### **Advent Fellowship**

Volunteers will coordinate a reception for one of our evening Advent services. This will include making coffee, setting up a dessert table, finding volunteers to bake, serve, and clean up.

#### **Lenten Soup Suppers**

A volunteer group will coordinate, serve and clean up for one of our Wednesday Lenten suppers. This will include setting up serving tables, making soup and desserts for that week, serving dinner, and cleaning up.

#### **Fall Fest**

This school and church event is a time for fellowship and fun for all ages. Volunteers are needed to set up, clean up, run games and activities, and serve food. Possible Dates for 2024: Wednesday, September 18 or Wednesday, September 25.

#### **Daddy Daughter Dance**

This annual event features Dads and Daughters in an evening of dancing, refreshments, and fun! Volunteers are needed to set up, greet, chaperone, help with food service, and/or clean up.

#### **School Benefit Auction**

This annual event is an end-of-school-year celebration and fundraising benefit to support Trinity Lutheran School and various special projects through financial gifts. This event is managed by a committee of parent volunteers, alumni, and staff who work together to plan, organize, set up, clean-up, and put together programming each year based on that school year's theme.

#### **Special Events Team**

The Special Events Team is a group of volunteers who are available to help with various tasks at our many special events. From assisting to planning events, this team is on call and ready to help!

#### Chili Cookoff/Brew Event

This annual event features Trinity's best brewers and chili cookers. Volunteers are needed to enter their favorite beer or chili, set up, clean up, or greet.

#### **Quilters**

The Quilting group meets on the second Friday of each month from 9am-11am in the school art room. No sewing skills required- they can teach you! Quilts are given to various ministries serving those in need.

#### **Bag Ministry**

This group meets every Monday from 12:30-2pm in the narthex. They sort, inspect, then fold recycled plastic grocery bags and organize them in boxes to be used at Church Community Services food pantry. The task is simple, but the impact is great!

#### **Outreach Collections**

Near the church restrooms you will see receptacles for plastic grocery bags as well as a large bin to collect non-perishable food items for Church Community Services. Feel free to donate as often as possible! Look for other special collection requests in the news and notes each week.

# **Care Ministries**

#### **Stephen Ministry**

Stephen Ministry is a one to one Christian Care ministry. Volunteers participate in a 50 hour training course to be equipped to serve those who are walking through a time of difficulty or change.

#### **Caring for the Elderly**

Volunteers help in various roles, whether it be through care calls, writing notes or cards, visiting someone who is homebound, or providing transportation to appointments.

#### **Prayer Chain**

Prayer chain volunteers sign up to be emailed prayer requests. The requests are kept confidential, and volunteers are asked to uplift those requesting prayer by praying for them as they are able.

#### **Funeral Team**

Volunteers come to assist with the visitation and funeral services as they are able. An email will be sent with the date and times of the service, and volunteers who are able will come and set up, provide support for the family, and assist the pastors as needed.

# **School Ministries**

#### **PTO (Parent Teacher Organization)**

This group is comprised of parents throughout the school community. It is open to all who wish to join. The PTO organizes events for the teachers and students to support them throughout the year. They also create and run these fun events for all to participate in and add some special fun during the school year.

#### **Sports Boosters**

Our boosters group is made up of parents whose kids are involved in many of our sports. They work hard to make sure all concession areas are up and running. They also offer special items and treats during various game nights based on a theme or a special dress day. They work to fund raise for future items such as new uniforms or various sport equipment.

#### **Grandparent's Day**

One of the most fulfilling times of the year when our K-8 students get to bring their grandparents to school for a full day of fun. This day begins with a time of fellowship and registration for our visitors. We all gather for a large assembly followed by an open house time for grandparents and students to roam the building participating in various activities.
